Posts: 8632	pads in place of the grinding wheels. All the guards, and rests are removed to get access anywhere on the wheel. Removing the guards is something I do. I don't suggest it to others. Buffing, and polishing compouds in stick form are used on the wheels.
	Even after I use the wheels on a piece, I'll still go over it with "0000" steel wool to even out the finish , and make it look like the spots the I didn't / couldn't use the wheels on. After that, it's a good washing in soapy water to get all the buffing dirt off of it, and dry with a super soft cloth.
