Checked it just now and there were a couple pieces of the green slime. Is there a way I got too much washing soda in there and caused this? I haven't done anything different and since it was a new batch of water, I know there wasn't any remaining crud left in it(though it was a mess when I cleaned it out).

I'm starting to wonder if it might be the plastic from your tank - some formulations can be slightly conductive. If the positive current is in contact with the tank and your harrow disk is caked up with rust it might be a situation where the tank is starting to "give up" its more conductive materials. I've never heard tell of it but I would suppose it's possible. I work in the paint application industry and it's quite common to see plastic parts sprayed electrostatically and for that to work, the plastic part has to have some conductivity.

Perry, It spent a week in the lye bath, I would think that would have taken care of any grease/oil. Top looked clean and the bottom had some rust, btw, the Green Slime was only on the top? Cheryl, brand new tank, setup about 3 weeks ago.

George, My anode is a sheet of 3/16 SS, 24 wide and goes around in the tank about 80%. Tank is 60 gal., blue plastic electrolyte is 100% sodium carbonate 1TBS Per gallon of water, 40 gallons in the tank.

I have another piece in the tank now and will check it in the morning.

If the same shows up again? I will dump and start again. This is the first electro that I have used SS in, My other 2 tanks are scrap iron plates.

Could be something along the lines of what Perry referred to or maybe some other type of "protective coating" that was applied by a former owner - beeswax, shellac, etc. - that the lye bath didn't touch. Do you have any additional pieces that you know came from the same source? If you do, check 'em over to see if you notice anything a bit different than usual.

So maybe I was getting some type of built up gunk or maybe the washing soda causing a sludge due the negative side just running loose in the water????

I hope the repair solves the problem because I was getting the sludge each time I would run my tank.
